# Descendents of David Cowe (ca 1765 - unknown) and Helen Sharp (1765 - unknown)



## **1. David Cowe**. Born Approx 1765. Christen in Hutton, Berwickshire.

The surname has various spellings: Cow, Cowe, Kow, Cour, Cowie, Cowan or Cowen. According to family legend--which has not always been very accurate--they were drovers from the Lammermuirs who came south.

No record of David Cowe's father and mother has been found, so this family genealogy begins with David.

No record of David Cowe and Helen Sharp's marriage has been found. But under Scottish Law a couple could be married "by repute"--legally.

David was a barnsman at Fishwick Mains, when son James was baptized 17 Jan 1804. (Hutton baptismal records.)

(Information on the names, births and baptisms of the children from research by Fred Kennington and Bruce Elliott.)

He married Helen Sharp, daughter of John Sharp & Alison Bowmaker. Born 1765 in Berwickshire. Christen 5 Aug 1765 in Edrom.

Helen Sharp had the following siblings: Mary, baptized 25 Nov 1764, Edrom; James, baptized 2 Mar 1767, Edrom; Alison, baptized 26 Feb 1770, Edrom, died before 1792; David, baptized 10 Nov 1775, Ladykirk; Robert, baptized 26 Jul 1777, Ladykirk; Elizabeth, baptized 10 Sep 1790, Hutton; and Alison baptized 6 Feb 1792, Hutton. (Researched by Fred Kennington, Dec 2007.)

**2. Alison Cowe**. Daughter of David Cowe & Helen Sharp. Born Approx 1793. Christen 12 Jan 1793 in Parish Registers, Hutton.

Not sure if date of baptism is 12 Jan 1793 or 12 Jun 1793. (sources IGI, Bruce Elliott, Oct 2007; and Fred Kennington, Dec 2007.)

No further information.

**3. Robert Cowe**. Son of David Cowe & Helen Sharp. Born 1794 in Hutton. Christen 18 Sep 1794 in Hutton.

Family legend says that the Cowe family were carters who carried stone for the building of Coldstream Bridge. We know for certain that Robert Cowe, born 1794, brother of William and James, was a carter at some time. (From Fred Kennington, Stockport, Dec 2007.)

Robert was a farm worker at Norham in 1826 but was back in Hutton by 1834. He was Robert the carter in Hutton in 1851.

Robert and Ann had four children: David, George, Robert and Helen.

He married Ann Crosby, daughter of George Crosby & Catherine Lockie, 7 Jun 1822. Born in Ford.

- **4. John Cowe**. Son of David Cowe & Helen Sharp. Born 1796. Christen 15 Apr 1796 in Hutton.

John Cowe and Elizabeth Watson had seven children. All remained in agriculture, some as Farm Stewards, and continued to live in the general area. (Information from Fred Kennington, Dec 2007)

He married Elizabeth Watson, 18 Mar 1816 in Whitsome.

**5.** Christiana Margaret Cowe. Daughter of David Cowe & Helen Sharp. Born 1797 in Meadowhouse, Hutton. Christen 12 Nov 1797 in Parish Register, Hutton.

No further information.

**6. William Cowe**. Son of David Cowe & Helen Sharp. Born 1799 in Fishwick Mains. Christen 17 Dec 1799 in Hutton. Died 31 Aug 1882 in West Moneylaws, Carham. Buried in Ford Churchyard. Occupation Farm Worker.

William had an irregular marriage on 10 Aug 1822 at Coldstream Bridge to Mary Learmonth. To do that was the romantic thing of the day. So they walked from Hutton down to Coldstream, got married,

and walked back to Hutton where they were married in Hutton Kirk, having had a telling-off from the Minister. At that time, both William and Mary lived in Hutton Parish.

After their marriage William Cowe and Mary Learmonth soon moved over the Border into Northumberland where their children were born.

William and Mary lived with, or near, the Logan family, their daughter Alice's in-laws, later in life. It was John Logan who registered the death of William in 1882.

William's occupations were: 1822 Hind (farm worker); 1824 Labourer; 1851 Butcher; 1861 & 1871 Shepherd. All the family members were farm workers, or in the case of the Logans, farmers.

William died on 31 Aug 1882, aged eighty-two, then living at West Moneylaws, Carham. Cause of death - paralysis. (Information on this family was provided by Fred Kennington, Dec 2007.)

He married Mary Learmonth, daughter of James Learmonth (Lormount) & Margaret Dickson, 10 Aug 1822 in Coldstream Bridge. Born 1795. Christen 10 May 1795 in Nenthorn, Berwickshire. Died 9 Jun 1872 in Heatherslaw. Buried in Ford Churchyard.

The name "Learmonth" is very common in Berwickshire and Roxburgh, with varied spellings, such as Lamond, Lurmont. Mary's parents were James Lormount and Margaret Dickson, who were married at Nenthorn, Berwickshire on 25 Nov 1786.

Mary's siblings are: Robert, baptized 11 Jul 1787; James, baptized 21 Sep 1788; and Ann, baptized 16, Jan 1791; and also a sister Margaret whose birth has not been found.

Mary died 9 Jun 1872, aged seventy-seven, then living at Heatherslaw. Cause of death - 'old age'.

7. David Cowe. Son of David Cowe & Helen Sharp. Born 1802. Christen 7 Jun 1802 in Hutton.

David remained as a agricultural labourer in the Hutton area. No further information.

He married Isabella Gibson (Or Sligh), 26 Mar 1841 in Hutton.

(Information on marriage from Fred Kennington, Dec 2007)

**8. James Cowe**. Son of David Cowe & Helen Sharp. Born 31 Dec 1803 in Fishwick Mains, Scotland. Christen 17 Jan 1804 in Hutton, Berwickshire. Died 15 Jan 1875/1876 in Harvey, NB. Occupation Farmer. Religion Presbyterian.

From Baptismal record, Hutton: James, son of David Cowe, barnsman at Fishwick Mains, and Helen Sharp, his wife, was born 31st December 1803 and baptised 17th January 1804. Witnesses John Service and Thomas Laing. (research from Fred Kennington to Bruce Elliott, Dec 2007.)

Married irregularly 17 Mar 1826 Hutton, Berwickshire and rebuked in session and had marriage confirmed, June 1826. (From the Church of Scotland register 745/4 of Hutton, Berwickshire. Research by Bruce Elliott.)

James Cowe and his wife Isabel Donaldson were living at Horndean when daughter Mary was born in 1833; and James was a farm servant in Hilton when David was born in 1836.

James Cowe, age 32, his wife Isabelle Donaldson, age 31, his mother-in-law Mary (Aitkens) Donaldson, age 50; and three children: Eleanor, age 7; Mary, age 4; and David, age 1 ½ yr., left from the port of Berwick-upon-Tweed on 28 May 1837 on the brig Cornelius of Sunderland and landed in Saint John, New Brunswick, Canada, on 12 July 1837. They settled on Land Grant Lot #15E (which is beside the Harvey Settlement Cemetery) and were among the first settlers of Harvey Settlement.

The 1861 Census indicated that the Cowe family had 45 acres improved and 55 acres unimproved land. Cash value of farm was 150 pounds, and value of implements was 10 pounds. They had 3 horses, 3 milch cows, 5 other neat cattle, 12 sheep, 2 swine and slaughtered 250 lb. pork. Produced 200 lb. butter, 40 lb. wool, 9 tons hay, 180 bu. oats, 80 bu. buckwheat, 2 bu. peas, 10 bu. timothy, 40 bu. turnips and 60 bu. potatoes.

The first Presbyterian Church in Harvey Settlement was built on the Cowe land on the corner next to the Harvey Settlement Cemetery. In Feb 1854, James and Isabelle Cowe in consideration of the sum of twenty shillings lawful money deeded land "beginning at a stake on the south west corner of lot #15 east side of the Great Road leading from Fredericton to Saint Andrews, thence running 121 ft. north along Great Road, east 90 ft. to a stake; south 121 ft. to a stake in the fence at the burying ground, thence west 90 ft. to beginning" for the benefit and use of "Churches in Connection with the Presbytery of New Brunswick adhering to the Westminister Standards in connection with the Free Church of Scotland and not in connection with the Established Church of Scotland." However, there was a division in the congregation, and in July 1854 a similar sized lot of land on the Matthew Piercy Land Grant Lot #14W was deeded to the "Presbyterian Church of Nova Scotia for a meeting house" and another Presbyterian church was built where the present St. Andrews United Church is located.

The Cowe family were members of the Free Presbyterian Church. Old records from this church have not been located and presumably did not survive the passage of time. The Cowe family births, deaths, etc. are not entered in the Harvey Presbyterian Church records which began in 1856. The first Presbyterian church in Harvey was built on the corner of the Cowe Land Grant adjacent to the Harvey Settlement Cemetery.

The surname was spelled "Cowe" in the early years, but after 1874 it became "Cowie". Death date for James recorded by his daughter Annie was 15 Jan 1874, however his Last Will and Testament was written and signed by James on 30 Jan 1874, and was registered on 1 Feb 1876, so his death date was perhaps 15 Jan 1876.

Transcribed from photocopy of Last Will & Testament of James Cowe - No. 25711:

In the Name of God, Amen. This thirtieth day of January One thousand eight hundred and seventy four. I James Cowe Farmer in the Parish of Manners Sutton, York County, Being week (sic) in Body, but perfectly sound in mind Thanks be to God Therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body, knowing that it is appointed to all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament. That is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my Soul to Almighty God that gave it, and my Body I recommend to the earth to be buryed in decent Christian burial And as touching such worldly Estate where in to it hath pleased God to bless me in this life, I give demise and dispose of in the following manner and form. First I constitute, make and ordain Matthew Piercy and Robert Burrel as Sole Executors of this last Will and Testament. I also Will and bequeath to David Cowie my oldest son the Sum of \$40.00 Forty Dollars to be paid by my son John Cowe. I also will and bequeath to my son Robert Cowe the Sum of \$40.00 Forty Dollars to be paid by my son John Cowe. I also will and bequest to Isabela Smith my daughter the sum of \$20.00 Twenty Dollars to be paid by John Cowe And I also will and bequeath to Ann Delay (?) my daughter the sum of \$20.00 Twenty Dollars, All these legacies is not to be paid till twelve months after my decease. I also leave my beloved Wife Isabella Cowe to be kept by my son John Cowe or if she thinks proper after my decease to go to any other place John Cowe is to furnish her with \$20.00 Twenty Dollars every year in during her natural life to be Solely at her disposal. I hereby utterly disallow, revoke and disannul all and every other Testament Wills, legacies and bequests. Ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I hereunto have set my hand and Seal this date and year first above written.

(On 26 Jan 1876, Robert Burrell administrator of Will and upon oath declared to that he believed this to be the last Will and Testament of the within named James Cowe, sworn to before John Rutherford, J.P. Registered 1 Feb 1876.)

He married Isabelle Donaldson, daughter of John Donaldson & Mary Aitkins, 17 Mar 1826 in Hutton, Berwickshire. Born 1811 in Scotland. Died 1 May 1879 in Harvey, NB. Religion Presbyterian.

The following Family History written by daughter Annie Cowe, wife of Aaron Hay, to her son Willis Allan Hay, 21 Mar 1921:

"My great grandparents was John and Annie Donaldson. Their son John married Mary Aitkins. They were my grandparents. They had two children, Robert and Isabel. My grandfather died when Isabel was a baby and my uncle died when a young man twenty-one years and had been married one year. Isabel, my mother, was married when quite young to James Cowie, four children born to them in Scotland. Anne the eldest died with scarlet fever at the age of eight years. Next was Eleanor, Mary and David. He was one and half years old when they came to this country in 1837. They settled in Harvey. Their first child in this country was Isabel, then John and Robert and James. He died when two years old. Next was Annie (myself) then another James who died at the age of two. Eleanor married James McGuiggan. She died with scarlet fever when just a year married, the youngest boy and she died the same day and was laid in the same coffin. Eleanor and Mary were both married on the same day. Mary married Thomas Jones. They lived in Rusagonis. They had six children then she died when one of them was born she was not very old. Dunbar was the oldest child, then Annie, next was Emily & Maria. Annie has been dead for a long time. She left two boys Oscar and Henry. Philips, their grandfather raised them. My brother David married Abigail Philips. They had 11 children, Mary, Annie, Frances, Ruth, Susan, Pearl, and George, one little boy died and Minnie too (I forgot her) 3 of the girls are dead now. My sister Isabel married John Smith. He took her to Sydney Mines, Cape Breton. We never saw her again & she only wrote one letter home. She had 7 children. She died at the birth of the last one. They are all dead but one girl and she is married and living in the states. Their father is dead too.

"My brother John married Martha Philips. He got the homestead but sold it after mother and father died and he went to Medway, Mass. He had 5 children when he left. The 2 eldest girls are dead but he never wrote to me so I don't know much about them but John has been dead over 10 years.

"My brother Robert married your father's sister Annie Hay. They lived in this place with the rest from Harvey. Their children are Amanda, Isabel, Sarah Marie, and Matilda, then two died next comes Arthur, Martha, Elisabeth and Eva. They are all married now in the States.

"The next in my family is myself. I guess you know all about our "Family Tree".

"Your grandfather James Cowie, died in 1874, January 15th at the age of 70 years. Your grandmother Isabel Cowie died May 1st, 1879 aged 69 years."

9. Helen Cowe. Daughter of David Cowe & Helen Sharp. Born 22 Aug 1805. Christen 10 Sep 1805 in Hutton.

Helen was an agricultural labourer in the Hutton area, and had a daughter, Margaret Cowe, born approximately 1845. (Research by Fred Kennington, Dec 2007.)

10. Alexander Cowe. Son of David Cowe & Helen Sharp. Born 1812. Christen 18 Feb 1812 in Hutton.

Alexander remained in the Hutton area, he was an agriculture labourer. His mother (Helen Sharp) lived with them when widowed as did his sister Helen.

He married Agnes Dodds, 29 Jan 1843 in Hutton.

Alexander and his wife Agnes had seven children. (Information on marriage from Fred Kennington, Dec 2007)

David was apprenticed as a baker with his grandfather George Crosby, a baker in Berwick. David's bakery business passed down through the family for many years.

At the time of marriage in 1845, David was an agricultural labourer living at Bradford, near Bamburgh, and Eleanor lived at Burton, nearby. This part of the Cowe family were settled in that area and were Northumbrians, with their distinctive dialect, rather than Scots.

Theirs was an irregular marriage, as was his father's, but they did not have it confirmed by the church. As a matter of interest in the year 1845, a total of 280 irregular marriages took place in the Berwick area, the greatest majority at Lamberton but some at Paxton Toll, I Mordington Toll, Northam Bridge or Chain Bridge.

David and Eleanor had seven children, all born on farms in the Bamburgh/Lowick area.

"Cowe/ Helen, Daughter of James Cowe Hind at Broadmeadows and Isabel Donaldson his Wife, was born 23d of April 1830 and baptized June 6th following in Hutton Manse. Witnesses of Baptism Thomas Ingram Schoolmaster and Thomas Hay Serv't." (From The Church of Scotland register 745/4 of Hutton, Berwickshire, researched by Bruce Elliott, Aug 2007.) This daughter is known as Eleanor.

From Weekly Chronicle, Saint John, 30 Jul 1852: "Married 27th inst., by Rev. J. M. Brooke, James McWigan (sic) Fredericton parish and Miss Eleanor Cowe, Harvey Settlement."

Eleanor and her sister Mary were married on the same day. Eleanor died at age 23 years of Scarlet Fever, the same day as her youngest brother, James, age 2 years, also of Scarlet Fever.

Broken gravestone in Harvey Settlement Cemetery: In memory of Eleanor wife of James McGuiggan who died Nov 28, 1853 aged 23 years. Also James died July 26, 1849 (?) aged 3 years; James ( .....1853?) aged 2 years, sons of James and Isabella Cowe.

She married James McGuiggan, 27 Jul 1852 in St. Paul's Church Records, Fredericton.

In York Co NB Marriage Register C 1850-1866 (PANB), Names spelled "McWigan". Witnesses to marriage were George Phillips and Mahala A. Jones.

**21. Ann Cowe**. Daughter of James Cowe & Isabelle Donaldson. Born 27 Jun 1831 in Scotland. Christen 3 Jul 1831 in Shaws Lane Chapel, Berwick. Died Before May 1837 in Scotland.

Christened 3 Jul 1831 Berwick-upon-Tweed Chapel St. or Shaws Lane or Relief Chapel United. Died at age 8 years of Scarlet fever.

**22. Mary Cowe**. Daughter of James Cowe & Isabelle Donaldson. Born 1 Aug 1833 in Scotland. Christen 23 Aug 1833 in Ladykirk, Berwickshire. Died 1 Feb 1864 in New Maryland, NB.

From Ladykirk baptismal records: James Cowe and Isabel Donaldson, his wife, residing at Horndean, had a daughter born 1st August and baptised 23rd August 1833, named Mary. (Research from Fred Kennington to Bruce Elliott, Dec 2007.)

Mary and her sister Eleanor were married on the same day. Mary died at age of 31 years, and left five children.

Copied from Weekly Chronicle, Saint John, 30 Jul 1852: "Married 27th inst., by same (Rev. J.M. Brooke) James McWigan, Fredericton parish, York Co., and Miss Eleanor Cowe, Harvey Settlement." "Married same day, by same, Thomas H. Jones, Fredericton parish, York Co., and Miss Mary Cowe, sister of above Eleanor Cowe."

From York Co NB Marriage Register C 1850-1866 (PANB): Witnesses to marriage were George Phillips and Mahala A. Jones.

Copied from Religious Intelligencer, Saint John, 5 Feb 1864: "Died Maryland (York Co.) 1st, Mary w/o Thomas H. Jones, age 31, left husband, five children."

She married Thomas H. Jones, 27 Jul 1852 in St. Paul's Church Records, Fredericton . Born Approx 1817 in NB. Occupation Farmer.

From The Dairy of Alexander Machum Jr. 1845-1849, third part of four, printed in Generation, The Journal of the New Brunswick Genealogical Society, Fall 2003, page 50: "Oct 20 (1848) Died at Rushagonish, Martha, wife of Mr Thos. Jones, leaving a family of 2 children. She had been lately confined. She was daughter of John and Nancy Hutchinson of Jerusalem, and was a pious youth."

Thomas Jones and family are in the 1861 Census, Parish of New Maryland. He is 44 years old, born in NB, farmer, Baptist. Besides his wife and children David age 6, Ann age 5, Emily age 3, and Maria age 1, also listed is a daughter Isabell, age 15, born in NB, deaf and dumb. (Perhaps Isabell is a daughter from a previous marriage??)

Thomas H. Jones and his wife Mary Cowe had five children: Dunbar, Annie, Emily, Maria, and Charles. (Charles died in infancy.)

Notes from Fred Kennington, Dec 2007: "Peter Cowe is still a bit of a mystery. As a child the family lived near Ford and he attended Ford School. Lady Louisa Marchioness of Waterford, lived at Ford Castle. She was an accomplished artist who painted religious murals on the interior walls of the school, using local people as models. The identity of some of them is known. Peter was said to be one of them but there is no record. Family legend said that Lady Waterford spotted Peter's artistic talent and sent him to a London art school. He was said to have worked as an artist on 'Punch' and that he was an official war artist for the Boer War. I have not been able to confirm any of that. The only possible reference I can find to Peter comes from the 1891 census when Peter Cowe, born Scotland, with his wife and child were living in Stoke Newington, London. His occupation was Bullion Broker's Clerk. He has not been found in the 1901 census. If this is 'our' Peter he could have had art training in London but would presumably need a job. Working in a Bullion Broker's office he may well have been sent out to South Africa. I would love to solve the mystery of Peter. The records of Ford & Etal Estate do not refer to him."
